WILLIAM HAMMOND COLE, M.A., CANTAB., F.R.A.S., F.R.G.S., *Deputy Superintendent, 3rd Grade*.—Appointed to the Educational Department, North-Western Provinces, direct from England, 14th April 1862, as Professor of Mathematics at the Government College, Agra ; sick leave from 9th September to 8th November 1863 ; permitted to resign appointment from 1st March 1864 on account of continued ill-health ; after nearly three years' residence at Mussooree as Mathematical Master at Mr. Maddock's School, was re-appointed to the Government service, 3rd January 1867 as Probationary Assistant Surveyor in the Great Trigonometrical Survey of India, and Assistant to the Officer in charge of the Computing Office, being at the same time placed in charge of the Photozincographic Branch of the Computing Office, Dehra ; appointed Assistant Surveyor, 2nd grade, on 1st September 1867 ; conducted the duties of the Computing Office in all its branches from middle of December 1867 to beginning of April 1868, during the absence of Mr. J. B. N. MAJOR ANDREW WILSON BAIRD, F.R.S., A.I.C.E., F.R.G.S., Royal Engineers, Deputy Superintendent, 3rd Grade.—Joined the service, 18th December 1861 as Lieutenant, R.E.; arrived in India, 4th March 1863; served with the Bombay Sappers and Miners from 2nd April till 4th May 1864, when he was appointed to Bombay Public Works Department as Probationary Assistant Engineer; Assistant Engineer, 2nd grade, 28th March 1865; promoted to 1st grade, 1st April 1865; employed up to December 1865 in the Harbour Defences of Bombay, and held charge of the works at Pounpir and the construction of the Middle Ground and Oyster Rock batteries; appointed Special Assistant for Reclamations, 7th December 1865; constructed the Workshops and Boat Basins, and erected all the machinery for the Government Reclamation Works at Mody Bay; promoted to Executive Engineer, 4th grade, 2nd October 1867; appointed Assistant Field Engineer with the Abyssinian expedition, 30th January 1868; returned from Abyssinia, July 1868; continued under Military Department till November 1868, to arrange for the disposal of the Railway stores and Engineer stores and plant, sent back from Abyssinia; appointed to the Trigonometrical Survey of India as Assistant Surveyor (corresponding to present Assistant Superintendent), 2nd grade, 4th December 1868; employed on Triangulation in the Kattywar and Guzerat Parties, 1868 to 1870; furlough to England for one year and 7 months on medical certificate, 14th May 1870; in July 1871, while on furlough, was specially employed by order of the Secretary of State to study the practical details of Tidal observations, and their Reductions by Harmonic Analysis as carried on under the superintendence of Sir William Thomson; promoted Assistant Superintendent, 1st grade, October 1871; on return to India in April 1872 did duty with the Kattywar Party; in November 1873 organized the Bombay Tidal and Levelling Party; employed until March 1874 in carrying out a reconnaissance of the Gulf of Cutch and in selecting sites for the three Tidal observatories, and afterwards engaged in Bombay in fitting up, modifying, and testing the Tide gauges; Local Captain, 18th December 1873; Captain, 4th April 1874; under the re-organization of the Department, reverted to Assistant Superintendent, 2nd grade, May 1874; completed the Tidal observations on Gulf of Cutch, and dismantled the observatories in June 1875; employed on the connected Levelling Operations in Kattywar and Guzerat up to the end of season 1875-76; on special duty in England from September 1876 to May 1877, carrying out the calculations for reducing total observations of Gulf of Cutch; by order of the Secretary of State remained at Aden (*en route* to India) to report on the Tidal observations which had been taken there by the Public Works Department, and to arrange for future observations; returned to India, June 1877; in July 1877, was appointed to the general superintendence and control of Tidal observations upon the Indian coasts, and was empowered to make all arrangements in direct communication with the Governments of the Maritime provinces; these operations have gradually been extended until twenty Tidal observatories (in India, Burma, and Ceylon) have been simultaneously at work, and some six thousand miles of Levelling operations of precision have been carried out; promoted to Assistant Superintendent, 1st grade, 1st January 1879; on deputation as Commissioner, Venice Geographical Congress and Exhibition in August and September 1881; the Survey of India exhibited a complete set of Tidal apparatus, diagrams, &c., and thus was represented in class II, Hydrography, in which class a Diploma of Honour was awarded to the Department; furlough to Europe for 1 year and 148 days from 16th October 1881; promoted to Major, 18th December 1881; Deputy Superintendent, 4th grade (new), 1st July 1882; returned from furlough and resumed charge, Tidal and Levelling Operations, 20th April 1883; Officiating Deputy Superintendent, 3rd grade, from 29th May 1883 to 3rd April 1884; leave to Europe on urgent private affairs, 4th April 1884 to 28th September 1884; Officiating Deputy Superintendent, 3rd grade, and resumed charge, Tidal and Levelling operations, from 1st October 1884; Officiating Master of the Mint, Calcutta, from 11th July to 12th October 1885, and from February to 30th September 1886; Officiating Mint Master, Bombay, from 1st October 1886 to 5th January 1887.
