COLONEL H. R. THUILLIEB, Royal Engineers (Bengal), Surveyor-General of India. - Joined the Honourable East India Company's Military College, Addiscombe, 11th June 1855; obtained his commission as 2nd Lieutenant, 12th June 1857; on duty at the Royal Engineering Establishment, Chatham, from 1st August 1857 to February 1859; promoted to 1st Lieutenant, 27th August 1858; arrived in India, 29th April 1859; appointed to the Survey Department as 2nd Assistant, Great Trigonometrical Survey, 21st May 1859; attached to the Great Indus Series Party from 20th November 1859 to 28th February 1861; promoted to 1st Assistant, 1st February 1861; transferred to the Kashmir Survey and employed thereon from 1st March 1861 to 28th February 1862; appointed to the charge of the Levelling Party, 1st March 1862; appointed to the charge of the East Calcutta Longitudinal Series Party, 1st September 1862; employed on that undertaking till its completion in November 1867; then commenced the Brahmaputra series; designation of appointment changed to Surveyor, 3rd grade, 1st April 1866; promoted to 2nd grade, 1st September 1869; designation changed to Deputy Superintendent, 2nd grade, 1st September 1869; Captain, 10th November 1869; employed on the Brahmaputra series triangulation till October 1870; then transferred to the charge of the Kumaon and Garhwal Topographical Survey; furlough to Europe, 14th March 1871; promoted to Deputy Superintendent, 1st grade, 18th July 1871; returned to India from furlough, 9th March 1873; resumed charge of the Kumaon and Garhwal Survey party in October 1873; employed on the survey of the Debra Dun and Jaunsar-Bhawar districts till April 1876; reverted to Deputy Superintendent, 2nd grade, 1st April 1874, under reorganization of the department, and officiated as Deputy Superintendent, 1st grade, from that date; appointed to officiate as Superintendent, Great Trigonometrical Survey, 4th April 1876; Major, 7th October 1876; reverted to Officiating Deputy Superintendent, 1st grade, 1st November 1876; transferred to the charge of the Mysore Topographical Survey in March 1877; promoted to Deputy Superintendent, 1st grade, 27th October 1878, under the reorganization of 1878; furlough to Europe from 17th November 1879 to July 1881; on special duty at Poona, July to October 1881; resumed charge of the Mysore Topographical Survey, November 1881; Brevet Lieutenant-Colonel, 7th October 1883; appointed to officiate as Deputy Surveyor-General, in charge Revenue Branch, from 5th March 1884; confirmed, 1st October 1884; appointed to officiate as Surveyor General of India from 24th February 1886; Lieutenant-Colonel, 12th August 1886; confirmed as Surveyor-General of India, 19th February 1887; Colonel, 7th October 1887. privilege leave for 3 months, from 11th April 1889.
