# MAP CATALOGUE.

### PREFACE.

The map catalogue is in two parts. Part 1 is issued separately or the complete catalogue may be obtained bound in one volume. Part 1 is issued at -/6/- or post free -/8/-, while the price of the complete volume is Re. 1/- or post free Rs. 1/8/-. Monthly lists of maps, published during the month, are issued and may be obtained on request from the Map Record & Issue Office. If so desired, at the time of purchase of the complete volume, on payment of an extra annas 8, these lists will be despatched monthly to the purchaser, until the publication of a new edition of the catalogue.

### Part I. This consists of:-

- (a) The letter-press of the catalogue which contains a short history of the Survey of India, and the method of obtaining maps from the Map Office.
- (b) The Indexes to the Triangulation Charts and Pamphlets available, Levelling Pamphlets available, three Series of Geographical Maps published, and three Indexes forming a synopsis of the topographical maps published.

Each Index is accompanied by its own references and notes and no further explanation is necessary.

Part I is, therefore, a complete catalogue of the maps of the Survey of India, with the exception of certain Town Guide Maps, Cantonment Maps, etc., on scales larger than I inch to I mile, but the small scale of the indexes to topographical maps does not permit of sheets, covering a special area, to be selected with accuracy.

Part II. This consists of:

- (a) Large scale indexes of the topographical maps available.
- (b) Lists of General, Provincial, District, Cantonment and Town, Manœuvre and Radius, Administration Report and Miscellaneous Maps.

Each area covered by a sheet of the 1/M series has two indexes facing one another. The index on the right shows, by a series of five reference colours, the largest scale (up to 1 inch to 1 mile) map, which is available for a particular area, and, the remaining topographical maps on smaller scales which are also published.

In cases where there is a white space left, in the reference to tints, this indicates that there are no maps of that scale in the particular sheet referred to.

The index on the left shows by a series of reference colours what maps exist on a scale larger than 1 inch to 1 mile. The information is further amplified by reference numbers and letters in red and an explanation at the foot of the index.

Part II when bound with Part I, replaces the three synoptic indexes of topographical maps contained in Part I, as the whole of the information contained therein would merely be repeated in the larger scale indexes.

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# SURVEY OF INDIA.



### MATTERS OF GENERAL INTEREST.

### HISTORY.

At the close of the eighteenth century such Indian Topographical Surveys as existed were the result of reconnaissances, many of them merely route sketches undertaken to assist or illustrate military operations. But in 1802, with the measurement of Lambton's Madras base line, the Indian Government Survey began to assume a more scientific character.

2. In 1824 the preparation of ATLAS OF a quarter-inch map INDIA. known as "The Atlas of India" was planned to cover the whole of the country, and the first sheet was engraved and published in black in England in 1827. The sheets were compiled, and drawn in India and engraved in England until 1867, after which they were engraved in India.

From 1847 till 1883 the publication of the re-TOPO-GRAPHICAL, sults of the various REVENUE & Topographical, Re-CADASTRAL venue and Cadastral SURVEY. Surveys on scales larger than oneinch to four miles followed no systematic plan. Detached surveys were executed and the resulting maps generally on the scale of one-inch to the mile formed separate series, the sheets conforming not to projected limits of latitude and longitude, but to those of areas of administration or survey.

4. In 1883 the topographical STANDARD. IZATION OF OLD MAPS. scales were standardized. They were divided off into sections of 30 minutes of longitude by 15 minutes of latitude, and each

Province was given its own series of numbers.

5. In 1905 a systematic scheme MODERN for the publication of MAPS. the maps of India in colours, was accepted. The long deferred adoption of the true longitude of Madras. viz.:—80° 14′ 54″ East of Greenwich was decided on for all Indian maps. This value is less than that used for the old maps by 2′ 27″18, so that there is a gap of 2′ 27″18 between the eastern margin of a sheet published in the old style and the western margin of a modern sheet. This is inconvenient, but the correction to the longitude was essential and unavoidable, if the Indian Surveys were to join up accurately with those of other countries.

### GENERAL CLASSIFICATION OF INDIAN MAPS.

- 6. Under the 1905 scheme the whole of Southern Asia was divided into sheets of suitable sizes for the various scales (as explained in para. 5.) and a definite programme was drawn up for the systematic mapping of the area, on small scales, to form a series of Geographical Maps, and on large scales to form a Topographical
- 7. The topographical scales decid-TOPO. ed on were one-inch GRAPHICAL to one mile, one-inch MAPS. to two miles, and oneinch to four miles. For the topographical series, British India was divided into areas according to the largest scale necessary. The major portion was to be on the one-inch scale and the remainder, except for a small

area on the quarter-inch scale, was to be mapped on the half-inch scale. Areas mapped on the one and halfinch scales were also to be published on the smaller scales.

8. The scales adopted for the GEO. Geographical series Were 1:1,000,000 or MAPS. 1/M (about 16 miles to 1 inch), 1:2,000,000 or 1/2M, and

1:4,000,000 or 1/4M. The whole area of Southern Asia embraced by the scheme will eventually be mapped on these scales. As the mapping of the smaller scales is taken up subsequent to the completion of the larger scales, a portion only of the 1/2M

sheets are published and none of the All details are given in Appendix I. 1/4M sheets at the present date.

9. To meet various requirements GENERAL a series of general maps of India have MAPS. been compiled on scales ranging from 32 miles to 192 miles to the inch.

10. A number of maps on vari-SPECIAL ous topographical MAPS. scales, but not part of the general scheme for topographical maps, are published in colours (vide Appendix 5).

### THE NUMBERING OF MODERN MAPS.


11. Under the 1905 scheme the whole of Southern Asia between the meridians 44° and 124° East of Greenwich and the parallels 4° and 40° North is divided up into sheets of 4° latitude by 4° longitude on the scale of 1/M, the sheets are numbered from north to south in strips, consecutively from the north-west.

Each Indian 1/M sheet is divided into 16 sheets of 1° latitude by 1° longitude, on the quarter-inch scale, known as Degree sheets and lettered from A to P.

Each quarter-inch Degree sheet is, in turn, subdivided into 4 half-inch to the mile sheets of 30' latitude by 30' longitude, known as Half-inch sheets and lettered N.W., N.E., S.W., S.E.

Each quarter-inch or Degree sheet, is also divided into 16 oneinch to the mile sheets of 15' latitude by 15' longitude numbered from 1 to 16 and known as One-inch sheets.

The following diagram explains Example—Thus: the numbering:-



- (1) The 1 M sheet which includes Delhi is 53.
- (2) The Degree sheet which includes Delhi is 53 H.
- (3) The Half-inch sheet which includes Delhi is 53 H/N.W.
- (4) The One-inch sheet which includes Delhi is 53 H/2.

The modern maps on the above scales are of one uniform size, viz.:- $24 \times 19$  inches.

12. MILITARY MESH. For military reference purposes a different division of the 1/M Sheet has been devised to that explained above and the two should not be confused. The military mesh consists of a printing in purple on certain copies of the topographical series of the lines bounding I' squares with their appropriate reference letters. A full explanation is contained in I. A. O. 724 of 1924.

### DETAILS REGARDING TOPOGRAPHICAL MAPS.

13. The modern one-inch and half-inch topographical maps are published in seven colours, viz.:-

Black for outline and lettering. Blue for water forms. Red for roads and sites. Yellow for cultivation. Green for wooded areas. Brown for contours, cliffs, broken ground etc. Grey for hill shading.

In addition, administrative boundaries are printed with ribands in various colours.

The Quarter-inch or Degree sheets are published in the above colours omiting the Green and Yellow tints.

14. ONE-INCH SHEETS. On these sheets hills are represented by contours at 50 feet interval with the addition of hill shading to emphasize the more important ranges. Price Rs. 1-8-0 per sheet.

- 15. HALF-INCH SHEETS. On these, hills are shown by contours at 100 feet interval and by hill shading. Price Rs. 3-0 per sheet.
- 16. QUARTER-INCH OR DEGREE SHEETS. On these, the contour interval is 250 feet. The normal sheet has hill shading and shows administrative boundaries. Price Rs. 1-8-0 per copy. A certain number of sheets are also published on which altitudes are shown by graduated layers of colours, while the administrative boundary ribands are omitted. Price Rs. 3-0 per sheet.

In certain areas, for which modern maps are not yet in existence, the old maps in black only are published. Price Rs. 1-8-0 for sheets of double width, Re. 1-0 for sheets of single width (Provisional Issues).

- 17. TOWN GUIDE MAPS are published for a number of towns on scales 3 inches = 1 mile and over. Details are given on the Topographical Indexes (left hand) in Part II and in Appendix 4.
- 18. **FOREST** MAPS. All Forest Maps are stored and sold by the Officer in charge, Forest Map Office Dehra Dun. These maps are published on the scales of 4 inches, 3 inches and 2 inches to the mile.
- A Catalogue of these Maps may be obtained from the Forest Map Office and from the Government Book Depot, 8 Hastings Street, Calcutta. Price Rs. 2-0.

### DETAILS REGARDING GEOGRAPHICAL MAPS.

Two editions are published of each sheet, completed from modern material, viz.:—

In cases where modern material is not available Provisional Issues are printed in black and brown only. Price Re. 1-0.

23. When maps are required to be mounted, the style of mounting required should be stated. Experience has shown that the following styles meet most requirements:—

20. THE IMPERIAL ATLAS OF INDIA consisting of all the published sheets of the India and Adjacent Countries Series in the Political Edition, bound in a loose leaf patent binder of red cloth boards complete with Title page and index to sheets can be obtained at the price of Rs. 100-0-0.

21. SOUTHERN ASIA SERIES. This is the name given to the series on the scale of 1/2,000,000 or 1/2M or about 32 miles to 1 inch. Each sheet of these maps comprise 12° of longitude and 8° of latitude, that is six times the area covered by a sheet of the India and Adjacent Countries Series.

It is published in the same colours and editions as the India and Adjacent Countries Series.

CARTE INTER-22. **LA** NATIONALE DU MONDE. This is the name given to the series of sheets undertaken on the scale of 1/M to meet the views of an International Committee which assembled in London in 1909 under the auspices of His Majesty's Government. The sheets comprise an area of 6° of longitude by 4° of latitude that is one and a half times the area of a sheet of the India and Adjacent Countries Series. The unit of height adopted for this series is the metre instead of the foot, otherwise it is rather similar to the Layered Edition of the India and Adjacent Countries Series. In one edition only. Price Rs. 3-0 per sheet.

Maps can be mounted either singly, or several sheets can be joined together and mounted in any of the above styles as a single map. Styles 2 and 3 can also be provided with stiff board covers cloth bound.

The charges for map mounting vary from time to time according to the market price of materials. Estimates for mounting any map are furnished and prepayment is required before the mounting is put in hand.

### HOW MAPS MAY BE OBTAINED.

- 24. **SALE OF MAPS.** Maps published by the Survey of India are available for sale to the various Departments of Government and to the Public.
- 25. **ORDERING MAPS.** Maps may be ordered from:—
  - 1. The Map Record & Issue Office, 13 Wood St., Calcutta, (Telegrams: Surmaps).
  - 2. The Directors of the various Survey Circles, (see Contents).
  - 3. The Agents for Maps situated in most of the large centres, (see Contents).

In ordering maps care should be taken to specify:—

- (a) the number of the sheet
- (b) its scale, and
- (c) the style of mounting required or unmounted.

Maps may be ordered by letter or telegram, no special order form being necessary, though for Government officials the form of Indent No. O-57 may be found useful. When ordering maps by telegram, a post copy of the telegram should invariably be sent in confirmation, to obviate mistakes and consequent delays.

26. **DESPATCHING.** Orders for unmounted maps will be despatched from the Map Record & Issue Office immediately on receipt of the order, but for mounted maps there will be some delay, depending on the style of mounting and the size of the order, as mounting is only carried out to order. Despatch is usually made by Parcel Post, or by rail for large consignments, but may be made in any other way convenient to the purchaser. The cost of packing and postage is borne by the purchaser.

27. PAYMENT. Supplies made to Government Departments may be adjusted by book-transfer (vide para, 110, Chapter 6, Volume 1, of the Civil Account Code, 8th Edition 1920); but, when the adjustment of the account by book-transfer is not feasible, a settlement of the account may be made in cash.

Supplies to the Public are ordinarily made V. P. P. but when mounted maps are ordered a remitance must accompany the order, and mounted maps once supplied cannot be received back into stock.

Cash payments may be made by Money Order, by Remittance Transfer Receipt or by cheque crossed to Imperial Bank of India, Calcutta. Cheques on banks outside Calcutta should have the usual commission charges added to the amount.

28. RETURN OF MAPS. will be received back in the Map of the maps will be refunded.

Record & Issue Office, if returned Unmounted maps, ordered in error, immediately unsoiled, and the value

Mounted maps, whether ordered in error or not, cannot be received back by the Map Record & Issue Office.

### MAPS FOR MILITARY UNITS.

29. In conformity with War Office policy the one-inch map is now the standard tactical map both for training and war. But in India the half-inch map is the largest scale available for large areas of the country.

Maps on Japanese paper are now used for training and manceuvre purposes, without a linen backing. These maps on the scale of 1/M(political edition), quarter-inch (political edition), half-inch and one-inch to the mile are available at the special military rate of Rs. 1-8 for the half-inch sheets and annas 12 for the remainder.

An extra charge of annas 3 per copy is made for those modern size sheets which are surprinted with the Minute Mesh.

Before indents are submitted, catalogues and index sheets should be consulted to see what maps, and on what scales these, are available. These catalogues and indexes are supplied to all fighting units and Headquarters of formations. They are also obtainable from the Map Record & Issue Office

Indent forms No. O 57 for 'Ordinary Maps' and O 57 (a) for 'For Official Use Only' Maps are supplied gratis and should ordinarily be used, but are not essential.

All applications for 'For Official Use Only maps must be counter-signed by a Brigade Commander or higher authority.

Any officer entitled to draw contingent bills, may obtain maps on book debit, the cost being subsequently adjusted through his Accounts Officer. It is essential that the name of the Accounts Officer under whose audit control he is, should be stated on the application. Maps may also be obtained on eash payment or by V.P.P.

### 30. SPECIAL MILITARY MAPS.-

(a) Attention is invited to para. 3 (c) (iii of I.A.O. 580 of 1926. (b) All reprints for the production of special maps will be made through the Chief of the General Staff for approval and classification.

Special maps will not be supplied at concession rates.

Attention to the following points will probably obviate disappointment and may save expense :-

- (a) Formations desiring order special maps for training purposes should give the Chief of the General Staff as much notice as possible.
- (b) Maps on the quarter, half and one-inch scales should conform to the style of ordinary Survey of India maps. This is to avoid artificiality and to ensure that troops are trained in peace on the same kind of maps which they will use in the event of operations within the limits of the Survey of India.


