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## PREFACE

The National Archives of India has a rich collection of cartographic records in its custody. It has been trying to make them easily accessible to research scholars through compilation of suitable finding aids. It has so far brought out Catalogue of Historical Maps of the Survey of India (1700-1900) in 1975, Catalogue of M.R.I.O. Miscellaneous Maps of the Survey of India in 1982, Catalogue of Forest Maps of the Survey of India in 1984, and Catalogue of Printed and Published Maps in 1986. The present volume concerning Memoirs of the Survey of India is the fifth in the series.

Covering the period from 1773 to 1866, this Catalogue contains 423 Memoirs of the Survey of India, which are in the custody of this Department. This manuscript collection is an admixture of Field Books, Journals, Memoirs, Registers, Reports and records on Routes.

The work of compilation was done by Sarvashree S.R. Batheja, Archivist and Zile Singh,

Asstt. Archivist under the supervision of Sarvashree P.K. Ghosh, Asstt. Director of Archives and S.N. Sharma, Dy. Director of Archives. Shri Gulab Madnani made the typescript ready. My thanks are due to them for their efforts in bringing out this volume.

## INTRODUCTION

The memoirs catalogued in this volume embody work of the route surveyors, most of whom were attached to the British armies in India. They mapped and surveyed the routes of army movement, and, in the process, explored the entire country from one end to the other. The information gleaned by these surveyors was principally for military purposes. Gradually, with the transformation of the East India Company into a territorial Power, it was also used for promoting efficient administration of the area under the Company's control. One of such groups of records in the custody of the National Archives of India and containing the aforesaid type of information is known as the Survey of India Manuscript Collection of Memoirs. Covering the period 1773 to 1866, it comprises Field Books, Journals, Historical & Statistical Memoirs, Registers, Reports and records on Routes.

The greater part of 423 volumes included in this collection was transferred by the Survey of

India to the National Archives of India in 1955. These volumes have been catalogued groupwise in chronological order. Undated memoirs have, however, been placed at the end of each group. A detailed groupwise Index showing the names of places and authors has also been added at the end.

It may be mentioned that besides these 423 volumes of memoirs catalogued in this Volume, 180 volumes of memoirs have not been transferred to this Department by the Survey of India. Efforts are being made to retrieve these volumes.

As already stated, these memoirs, though penned with a specific purpose in view, their variegated contents are both rich and useful. They furnish information mainly on military strategy, topography, social, economic and agrarian matters, forest conservation and meteorological and astronomical phenomena.

The memoirs catalogued in this volume furnish interesting research material for historians, geographers and other social scientists. Some of

the interesting included in this collection are: Memorandum from Kishan Gopal Missur on Maratha raids in Bengal during the Subedarship of Ali Vardi Khan (Journal, 19), Abstract memoir of the survey of the southern coast of Java by G.P. Baker, 1815-16 (Memoir, 62), An account of the hill tribes of Dindigul, 1817 (Memoir, 73), John Crawford's report on Siam, Malay Peninsula and Greater India, 1824 (Memoir, 88), Description of 4,000 miles of roads in the Carnatic by John Pringle, 1775-84 (Routes, 1), Details of the march of the 'Grand Army' in the Carnatic commanded by Lieutenant General Sir Eyre Coote, Major General Sir Hector Manro and Major General James Stuart, 1780-83 during the Second Anglo-Mysore War (Routes 4,5,6). Another valuable set of documents catalogued in this volume are the Registers of villages.

Information on the above topics is widely dispersed amongst these volumes. But effort has been made to compile this catalogue in a manner

that users would be able to lay their hands easily on the desired information.
